Safe Space – crisis respite service in Kirklees for people with a learning disability and autism



What is a Safe Space - crisis respite service?

Sometimes we can become poorly because of our mental health.



Our mental health can affect us in lots of different ways.

When we become sad and worry a lot it can affect our mental health.



We might start to have problems at home with our families or other people that support us.



The new Safe Space - crisis respite service is being set up to support people with a learning disability and autism.

It will be there for people who are not well because of their mental health and because of the difficulties they are having.



The Safe Space will be there to support people so that they can start to feel better again and go back home.



The new service is in a registered nursing home where people go for short stay accommodation and support.



The aim of the service is to offer support to people with a learning disability and autism to stop them from going into hospital or an Assessment and Treatment unit.
